THE PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT IN ROMAN LAW, SERBIAN CIVIL CODE AND THE GENERAL PROPERTY CODE OF MONTENEGRO

Summary: The partnership agreement is a consensual, mutually binding *bonae fidei* agreement. It was created within the framework of Roman law at a time when the development of socio-economic relations, and especially trade, required informal forms in order to facilitate legal transactions. If we ignore the small differences that exist in the regulation of certain real issues, which are actually a consequence of the adjustment of Roman law to the legal system of a particular state, it can be said that the Serbian Civil Code of 1844 and the General Property Code of Montenegro remained within Roman law.
