## LEGAL-HISTORICAL REVIEW OF REPORTING ON HUMAN TRAFFICKING

**Summary:** This paper deals with one of the most widespread forms of organized crime - human trafficking, through the history of legal thought - the birth of awareness and ideas about this problem, and the need for a legal framework, but on the other hand, also through the media discourse on this topic, through looking at importance that the media had in preventing, fighting and suppressing this form of organized crime.
